# **English Language Arts Department**

Welcome back to school!

One of the areas that many parents and students struggle with is writing. It's the area that can, at times, bring tears of frustration as your child sits and stares at the blank piece of paper in front of them. Unfortunately, there are no magic tricks to make write simple and easy. Writing, like many things, comes back to the simple "practice makes perfect" strategy. That being said, there are some things that you can do to make writing less stressful for your child.

- Write every day. Yes, every day. If it's something that you do everyday, then it's nothing to be afraid
  of.
- Have them write simple things, like the directions for making a sandwich, following every step.
- Have them describe something they see every day, like their room or their favorite toy. Then, have them look at what they described, and help them pull out the details (all of those lovely adjectives that make writing come alive!). Add those details back into their writing.
- Use My Access. This program is a fabulous self-help tool for your child. Ask your ES for tips to help
  your child use this amazing tool. (The first My Access Parent/Student workshop is coming up in
  September! Please join us to learn to harness the power of this great program!)
- Use Moby Max: This is a free program available to K-8 students. Moby Max has writing units starting
  in third grade. Use these to help you develop your child into a strong academic writer! (Moby Max,

## College, Financial Aid, Awards at Graduation Information

- School Secondary Reports and Transcripts for Colleges and Scholarships:
  - Private Colleges ask for a School Report and Letter of Recommendation from your School's Guidance Department. Connecting Waters Guidance Department provides this for you but please give at least 3 weeks notice. Contact Guidance at <a href="mailto:guidance1@cwcharter.org">guidance1@cwcharter.org</a>.
  - Transcript Requests: If you need an official or unofficial transcript sent, please allow 5-7 business days. Contact transcripts@cwcharter.org or call 209-874-1119 ext. 6 to request a transcript.
- College Applications and Scholarships
  - Private Universities right away start researching private colleges for application deadlines, career schools for information, look for scholarships, do you need to take the SAT or ACT? If you need help, contact Guidance at guidance 1@cwcharter.org
  - CSU and UC Application Deadline is November 30th –apply for CSU (calstate.edu/apply) and UC (admission.universityofcalifornia.edu)
  - SAT or ACT by December several colleges have made the SAT or ACT optional, check with your college of interest for the admissions policies. For most colleges, December is the last month to take SAT (www.collegeboard.org) or ACT (www.actstudent.org). Make sure to use our school code CW use 053706, CWEB use 050352, CWCV use 053963 when you take the test.

  - O What is the FAFSA?
    - The FAFSA www.studentaid.gov is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and is the application used for all types of federal financial aid for junior colleges, trade schools, colleges and universities! Apply online between October 1st and March 2nd
  - Who should apply?
    - All graduating students planning to attend a junior college, trade school, UC, CSU, private

college/university, or out of state college/university.

- What is Cal Grant?
  - These are grants from California given to all students who are eligible based on income. They ask for your GPA Information which is submitted automatically for all 12th graders by Connecting Waters unless you have opted out option to opt out was on your Master Agreement and Acknowledgement of Responsibilities Form you signed with your ES.
- Why apply?
  - Don't assume you or your family makes too much money to get financial aid. You should still file the FAFSA! Many factors affect your financial need such as the number of children in your household in college and the age of your oldest parent. What's more, a number of colleges require their students to submit a FAFSA before considering them for institution-based financial aid. Also, the FAFSA is where you apply for loans.

- CSF Life Membership Awards graduates are honored with a gold cord for being an active CSF member for four (4) semesters. Applications due by September 15th. - Community Service Award graduates who meet the service requirement will receive a green cord

- Career Technical Education (CTE) Completers Students completing any of the CTE 2 year sequences of classes will receive a red cord at graduation. They will also have this noted on their transcript.
- State Seal of Biliteracy Award The State Seal of Biliteracy is a recognition by the State
  Superintendent of Public Instruction for graduating high school students who have attained a high
  level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages in addition to
  English.The State Seal of Biliteracy is marked by a gold seal affixed to the diploma or transcript for

- Golden State Seal Merit Diploma The Golden State Seal Merit Diploma (GSSMD) insignia is

# How can a student earn a 4.25 GPA? Here's an explanation of our "weighted GPA" policy

Students who take UC transferable courses at Community College courses will earn weighted honors GPA calculation for the course. Students who take UC Approved Advanced Placement (AP) courses will also earn the weighted honors GPA calculation. The honors GPA is calculated as follows: grades earned in UC approved Community College or AP courses will earn 5.00 GPA points for an A, 4.00 GPA points for a B, and a 3.00 GPA points for a C (D's and F's do not qualify for honors GPA). # All 11th grade students...UC Local Guarantee Eligibility in the Local Context Program

Connecting Waters participates in University of California's Eligibility in the Local Context program for 11th grade students. To find out if your student will qualify for participation, see <u>Local Guarantee (ELC)</u>. Students with an academically rigorous course load will be considered, criteria for consideration include: ag course pattern completion (11 a-g courses completed by end of Junior year), a combination of Community College and a-g courses, 11th graders who have general courses but have completed at least geometry will be considered, students with above average SAT and/or ACT scores will be considered.

### What are "a-g" College Preparation Courses?

**a-g College Prep Courses defined:** "a-g" is the course code that indicates the student followed the approved University of California and California State University course description and used the approved text(s). Course descriptions and their textbooks are posted on the school's web page under the Guidance Department. Students must use approved texts and course descriptions for a-g college prep credit on the transcript. Additionally, the course must be taught by an Effective Education (or "EE") who is properly credentialed to teach the subject according to CA credentialing standards. Talk to your ES if you need to find an EE for a subject! For course outlines, go to your school's website then High School then a-g Information.

Who should take a-g College Prep Courses? They are for students who wish to attend a California State University or University of California directly out of high school. "a-g" courses are highly recommended for students wanting to attend a private college or university directly out of high school. Students who are planning to attend a community college should discuss this option with his/her ES. Students who have not completed the a-g college prep sequence may be able to qualify for admission through alternative paths and should talk to the college or university directly. Any student wanting to return to their regular high school to graduate should be taking a-g coursework, especially in English and History.

Is my child ready for a-g College Prep Coursework? In general, a-g College Prep coursework is designed for students who read at the 7th grade, although students who read at lower grade levels may be ready for the rigor of the coursework depending on the student's goals and aspirations. Your ES can help you to determine the best placement for your child. All incoming 9th graders are required to take a math placement test to determine their math class.

# Students must earn grades of C- or better in all "a-g" courses to meet minimum college entrance requirements.

**GPA:** GPA is calculated using only "a-g" courses taken after the 9th grade. Although grades from 9th grade are not factored into the eligibility GPA, grades lower than a C in a 9th grade "a-g" course will not count toward satisfying the "a-g" college eligibility requirements (and in most cases, will need to be repeated).

- Minimum GPA for UC eligibility = 3.00

**Honors points:** UC and CSU will award up to 8 extra grade points for AP courses and UC transferable community college courses

### For UC only, the freshman admission requirements are:

- 1. Complete 15 UC-required college-preparatory ("a-g") courses, with 11 of those done prior to the start of 12th grade
- 2. Maintain a GPA of 3.0 or better (weighted by honors/AP bonus points) in these courses
- 3. OPTIONAL: Take the ACT With Writing or SAT Reasoning Test

Community college courses can be used to complete "a-g" subject area requirements as long as the course is a UC/CSU transferable course.
